

Financial aid distributed to Sudanese

Kuwait's Al-Najat implements various projects for Syrian refugees, orphans

AMMAN, Nov 14, (KUNA): The Kuwaiti Al-Najat Charitable Society has implemented various projects targeting Syrian refugees and orphans in Jordan as part of its annual activity to alleviate human suffering for vulnerable groups in the region's communities.

The head of the association's delegation to Jordan, Oud Al-Khamis, told Kuwait News Agency (KUNA) recently, that "Al-Najat Charity", during its current visit to the Kingdom, distributed batches of sponsorships to about two thousand orphans of Syrian and Jordanian refugees who have been sponsored by the association for years.

Al-Khamis added that he and Fahheel Zakat Director Ihab Al-Dabbous visited different areas in Jordan to deliver this aid to those who deserve it at the rate of 450 guarantees per day, in a move aimed at "alleviating the suffering of orphans and drawing a smile on their faces and instilling joy in their souls."

In addition, he stated that the delegation distributed financial aid to the 151 Sudanese families immigrating to Jordan, and also distributed financial aid to the 150 poor Syrian families in Jordan.

He pointed out that with the approaching winter season; Al-Najat Charitable Society developed a program to implement the "Warmth of Winter" project for Syrian refugees living in camps in Jordan by distributing the necessary materials to families for heating purposes.

He explained that the association takes into account the coverage of the largest number of vulnerable groups in the most needy communities by providing them with in-kind and cash assistance, pointing to the allocation of

funds to 80 widows in Jordan who do not have a fixed income or a breadwinner, as well as distributing lump-sum financial aid to 100 orphans through "Project Bab Khair" every Friday.

Regarding the value of the granted orphan's sponsorship, Al-Khamis said that one sponsorship amounts to 15 Kuwaiti dinars per month, noting that the association seeks, through the orphan sponsorship project, to extend a hand to orphans in a number of countries such as Yemen, Lebanon, Syria, Bangladesh, Kosovo, Albania and others.

On the preparation of lists of the needy and the target groups in these countries, he stressed the association's keenness to cooperate with a number of charitable institutions and societies in them to implement the project under the full supervision of the association.

He explained that the orphan's living conditions are studied and data is collected about him through a field researcher, in addition to preparing a comprehensive file of the orphan's documents, including the birth certificate, the father's death certificate, and the school certificate if the orphan is studying and based on the family's income.
